The Department of Engineering Technology at Western Washington University seeks applicants to fill a full-time, tenure-track, Assistant Professor position(s) to begin September 16, 2009 with the option of starting March 16, 2009. Salary is commensurate with experience and qualifications.

**RESPONSIBILITIES**

Position responsibilities include: teaching courses in electronics engineering technology, continued curriculum development including laboratory development, student advising and recruitment, professional interactions with colleagues and industry, accreditation activities, student club and professional development activities. The successful candidate will be expected to maintain a relevant program of scholarly activity and to participate in department and University developmental activities.

**QUALIFICATIONS**

Required Qualifications:

- Masters of science degree (received from an accredited institution prior to the starting date) in electrical or computer engineering or engineering technology or a closely related discipline
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills

Preferred Qualifications:

- Three years of recent, relevant industry-based professional experience
- Ability to teach EET core courses and service courses along with upper division courses in one or more of the following areas: power electronics, digital signal processing, embedded systems, communication systems, or instrumentation.
- Demonstrated experience in electronics product design, development, testing, applications, or manufacturing.
- Successful prior teaching experience
- Ability to work with a diverse student body and staff
